Sports Premium Funding 2015-2016

From September 2015 the school is expecting to receive approximately £9,000 to promote sport and activity for all pupils. The school has always had a strong commitment to sport and we have always offered a range of after school activities for pupils to join.

Nevertheless, we have used the money to increase pupil activity and improve the quality of PE in the following ways:

| Action | Cost | Impact |
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| We have subscribed to the North East Derbyshire Sports Partnership. | £3000 | This has enabled us to enter local competitions against other schools in football, netball, cross country running, table tennis, tag rugby and to access on-going training for the PE Co-ordinator, which is cascaded to all staff. |
| Planning and assessment scrutiny to ensure it covers new curriculum and has high expectations | £100 0.5 days of Supply cover. | Children receive high quality PE provision. Monitor and assess PE progress. |
| To enter local sporting competitions as well as Young Ambassadors and Shooting Stars. Tournaments include: football, rugby, hockey, netball, table tennis, athletics and tennis. | £250 | This is to provide cover for teachers and any transport costs. Within this, the school has paid for opportunities to attend the dance platform. |
| Training for Mini Sport Leaders to lead games at lunchtime. | £300 Supply and resources cost. | At lunchtime, children will have opportunities to play a range of games. |
| On-going repairs to the Adventure Playground and Trim Trail | £2500 | Children have the opportunity to be active at break and lunchtime. Girls are encouraged to take part in physical activity. |



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| To hire the English Institute of Sport for Sports Day. | £700 | To enable pupils to have a go at 12 sports in the morning eg. long jump before participating in our annual Sports Day. |
| To train teachers on site to develop tennis by having instructors work with children while the teacher actively observes | £450 | Staff will understand the rules and how to help children to progress with their tennis skills. |
| To train teachers on site to develop rugby by having instructors work with children while the teacher actively observes | £960 | Staff will understand the rules and how to help children to progress with their rugby skills. |
| To train teachers new to Y5 in swimming. | £300 Course and Supply | Staff able to demonstrate high quality teaching of swimming with a group of children. |
| To do paired observations of the quality of teaching and learning of outdoor PE to be observed. | £600 | Teachers will be given developmental points to promote good, or better, outcomes for all pupils. |
